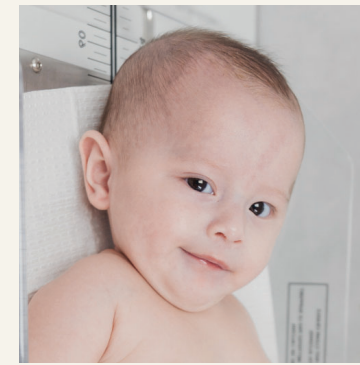

## Healthy, right from the start. Welcoming 200 babies to the IWS Family!

This fiscal year, we welcomed 200 newborns into the IWS family delivered through our midwifery program. Regular prenatal checkups lay the foundation for a healthy pregnancy and safe delivery, helping prevent complications for both mother and baby. After birth, infants visit IWS Family Health at least six times before their first birthday, ensuring they're growing strong, reaching developmental milestones, and exploring the world around them. New moms at IWS receive AngelBaby bags filled with essential supplies like diapers and thermometers, along with postpartum support and practical breastfeeding guidance to help them thrive during this important stage.

## Our PATIENTS

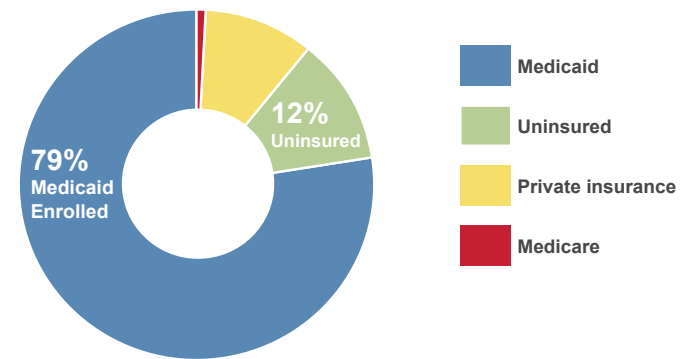
Approximately 93% of patient families lived at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.

Living at the poverty level, a family of four depended on an annual income of \$32,150.

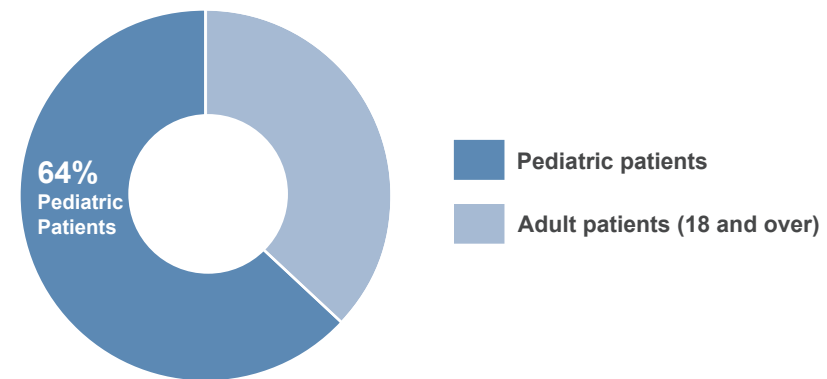

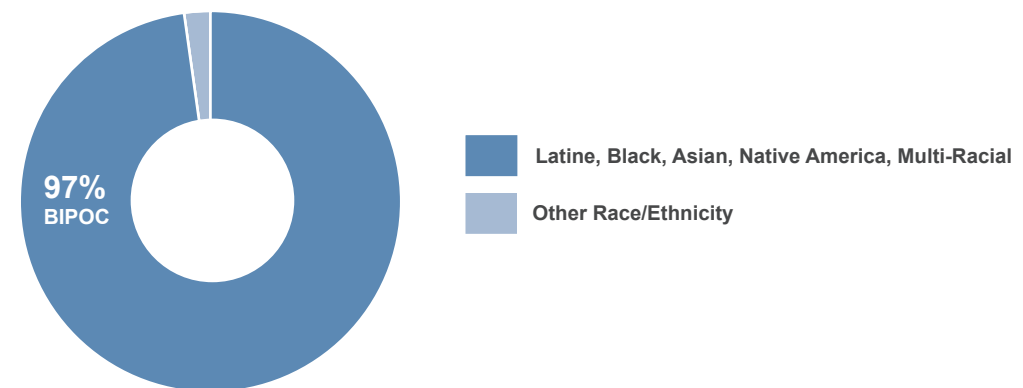
### Insurance Status



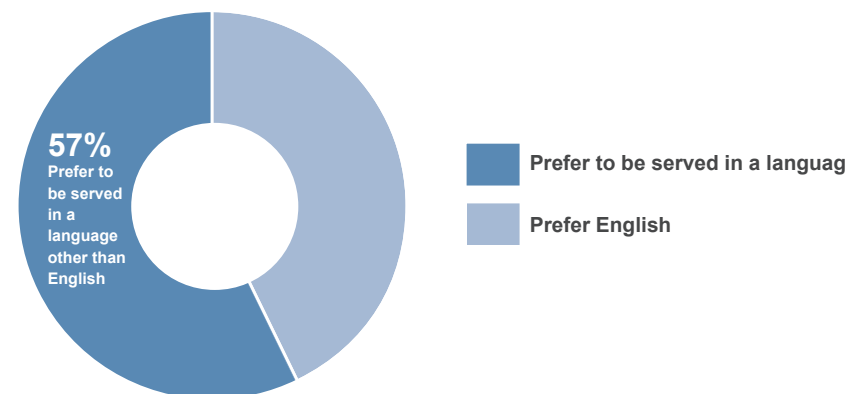
### Patient Age

### Linguistic Barrier



IWS's predominantly Latino, low-income, and Medicaid-enrolled patients face structural barriers. While characteristics such as age, gender, and ethnic identity are not risk factors in and of themselves, their intersection with socioeconomic inequities can compound challenges for immediate and long-term health, early childhood development, and education.

Many parents work in low-paying jobs: entry-level construction, daycares, fast food, landscaping, and retail. As the cost of living grows higher, the economic burden grows deeper.



## In Fiscal Year 2025, IWS Family Health opened our second site.



In its first three months of operation, From March to June 2025, IWS served 1,234 children at the IWS Family Health Dunning. The Dunning clinic serves primarily Medicaid-enrolled children, a Polish-speaking population and a growing Spanish-speaking community.



## When Care Connects: The Power of Integration



Marisol\* is a 39-year-old woman who began prenatal care at IWS Family Health. She immigrated from Ecuador in 2023 with her husband and nine-year-old daughter and had previously completed treatment for latent TB.

Marisol and her husband were surprised and pleased by their pregnancy, as her husband received treatment for leukemia and was told fertility would likely be affected.

Although Marisol appeared happy at her first visit, her depression screen showed that she was experiencing severe depression. She met with our social worker the same day, was diagnosed with major depressive disorder, and was promptly referred to long-term counseling. Marisol found therapy, particularly with a therapist who was also pregnant, to be very supportive.

Because Marisol also experienced severe back and inguinal pain during pregnancy, IWS referred her to physical therapy at our partner hospital, Humboldt Park Health. With physical therapy and a support belt, Marisol's pain became manageable. Due to advanced maternal age, Marisol was also closely monitored by maternal fetal medicine and reassured by monthly ultrasounds. Labor was induced one week early, and Marisol delivered a healthy 8 lb. 11 oz baby girl.

During her two-week postpartum follow-up visit at IWS, Marisol's mood was stable with a normal depression screen, and her baby, too, was doing well under pediatric care at IWS. Marisol remained committed to exclusive breastfeeding despite nipple pain and was referred to our lactation specialist, resulting in significant improvement by ten weeks postpartum. A cyst related to her stitches was identified at six weeks postpartum and successfully treated by another partner provider, whom Marisol trusted.

Although Marisol navigated multiple medical and emotional challenges during her pregnancy, trauma-informed, responsive, and integrated care at IWS allowed her to feel safe and supported during her pregnancy and experience the birth of her child in the most positive way.

# INTEGRATED *and* RESPONSIVE CARE



## Pediatric Health

We address the physical, mental, and emotional well-being of each child. Full-service primary care includes comprehensive medical screenings, developmental screenings, school-required physicals and immunizations, and psychiatric medication management.



## Adult & Prenatal Health

Adult patients receive physicals, preventive screenings, chronic disease management, and reproductive health services. Prenatal care, exams, and ultrasounds are provided by on-site midwives from Humboldt Park Health and Advocate Illinois Masonic Medical Centers.



## Care Coordination

Care coordinators help patients navigate social drivers, such as housing, food security, and transportation, that impact their health and social well-being by providing resources, offering socio-emotional support, and connecting them with internal teams and local partners.



## Behavioral Health

We provide short-term therapy for immediate, solution-focused support; long-term therapy utilizing evidence-based methods like cognitive behavioral therapy; probation therapy for adolescents in the juvenile justice system; and integrated psychiatric services.



## Child-centered Health and Advanced Therapies (CHAT)

We are the only community health center in Chicago that integrates developmental delay assessment and therapy with primary medical care in a single location. IWS partners with the renowned Lurie Children's Hospital to provide speech therapy on-site at our healthcare home.



## Dental Health

We are one of the few Illinois dental homes that provides Medicaid-enrolled pediatric patients with oral health prevention, treatment, and education. IWS integrates counseling and trauma-informed practices in dental to ease anxiety, a primary barrier to care.



## Food Pantry

Jane's Kitchen food pantry is exclusively available to patients. Fresh and nutritious food is provided by The Greater Chicago Food Depository at no cost.



# MESSAGE *from the* AUXILIARY

This year, the IWS Auxiliary demonstrated the extraordinary power of volunteers united in purpose. With the enthusiasm and commitment of over 500 members, we proudly provided over ONE MILLION DOLLARS in donations to the IWS Center—an outstanding 50% increase in FY25, with quarterly donations doubling. This unprecedented growth reflects not only the dedication of our members but also the confidence and generosity of our donors, partners, and the entire IWS community.

Our work was strengthened by our partnership with Heidi Ortolaza-Alvear, CEO, and the exceptional IWS staff, whose dedication to patient care inspires everything we do. Together, we advanced a shared mission of compassion and service.

We assembled 300 Angel Baby Bags for new mothers, prepared 600 Mother’s Day Gift Bags, filled 72 Bunny Bags, and created 150 Bean Soup Kits for patients. Through our partnership with Bernie’s Book Bank, we donated 300 baby books and provided 300 gift cards to the Kohl’s Children’s Museum to spark learning and joy among young children. Our members contributed over 130 handmade items, each crafted with care for the families we serve.

Our commitment to food security remained essential, supporting 2,000 families through Janie’s Kitchen. We also celebrated the installation of a new Sharing Library outside the clinic, extending our mission of education and community support.

Through the Warming Project, we raised over \$12,725 to purchase new winter coats and collected 1,389 new and gently used coats, along with hats, gloves, and scarves, ensuring that families stayed warm and cared for during Chicago’s harshest months.

Our fundraising efforts were equally inspiring. Chapters worked tirelessly to bring beloved events to life—including the Lake Forest Showhouse & Gardens, Wheaton Naperville Bridge and Golf Outing, Clarendon Hills Witches Ride and Light up the Night, Oak Brook Mistletoe Medley and Hinsdale Tablesapes. With over 12,500 attendees across these events, every ticket purchased helped fuel the programs and services that empower the families we support. And perhaps most inspiring of all, our members devoted over 30,000 volunteer hours—a powerful testament to their dedication.

We are deeply grateful for the dedication and generosity of our Auxiliary members and supporters. Your collective efforts have strengthened the IWS Family Health and uplifted thousands of families. With pride in all we accomplished and optimism for the year ahead, we look forward to continuing this meaningful work together.

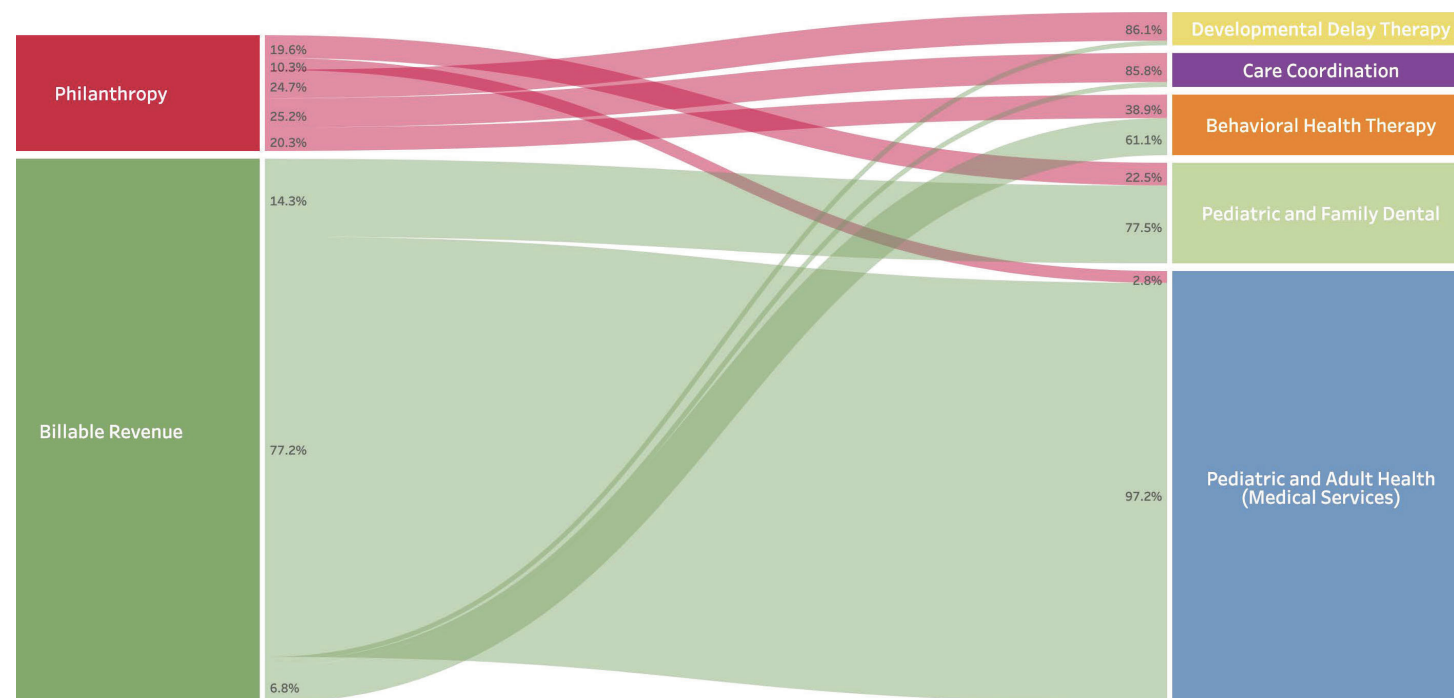

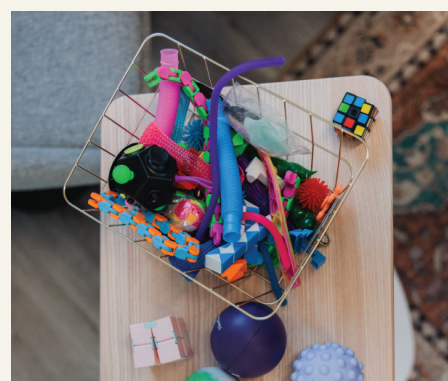
